## NEW BUSINESS

2. **52 Street STOP Sign**

### Materials

- Memorandum from the General Manager, Engineering dated June 26, 2025 regarding STOP sign on 52 Street.
- PowerPoint presentation titled “Transportation Advisory Committee” (On Table).

With the aid of a PowerPoint presentation, staff advised that a review was undertaken on a resident query regarding traffic on 52 Street and the stop sign on 52 Street at Upland Drive; recent data does not indicate an increased number of collisions, however overall traffic volumes have increased significantly over the past ten years. Staff then advised that further analysis will be undertaken to understand what is causing the increased traffic and the committee supported the retention of the stop sign.

## TRAFFIC CALMING

3. **Royal York Traffic Calming Update**

### Materials

- Memorandum from the General Manager, Engineering dated June 26, 2025 regarding Royal York Traffic Calming Project.
- PowerPoint presentation titled “Transportation Advisory Committee” (On Table).

Discussion ensued regarding the revised Royal York Traffic Calming plan (the “Plan”) and direction was provided to staff to bring the Plan forward to Council for consideration.

4. **Speeding on 114 Street**

Materials

- Memorandum from the General Manager, Engineering dated June 26, 2025 regarding speeding on 114 Street.
- PowerPoint presentation titled “Transportation Advisory Committee” (On Table).

With the aid of a PowerPoint presentation, staff spoke to a traffic analysis on 114 Street and advised that traffic counts indicate that speeds were within acceptable limits; however, a few vehicles were found to have significantly exceeded the speed limit. Discussion ensued regarding possible enforcement approaches for these outliers

5. **10A Avenue Update**

Materials

- PowerPoint presentation titled “Transportation Advisory Committee” (On Table)

Staff spoke to a resident concern regarding a recent accident on 10A Avenue; staff were able to confirm the incident was caused by a medical incident and not speed.

6. **Gillespie Road Update**

Materials

- PowerPoint presentation titled “Transportation Advisory Committee” (On Table).

Staff advised that correspondence was received regarding resident concerns over speeding and safety along Gillespie Road; the analysis provided by staff indicated that speeds are within acceptable limits and existing traffic calming measures are sufficient.

VERBAL UPDATES

7. **72 Avenue, 56 Street & View Crescent**

Staff advised that road construction on 72 Avenue - Phase 2 is on track with anticipated completion by end of August 2025. Also, the 56 Street sewer main project is ongoing, and the contractor will be activating a second construction crew.

Staff then provided an update on the traffic light located at View Crescent and 56 Street, advising that the vehicle detection loops have been cut due to construction. Signal timing changes are to be undertaken to provide additional green time to 56 Street.

Discussion took place around City of Vancouver opting to lower speed limits to 30 km/hr in some areas. Staff advised they would review and bring forward for discussion at a future committee meeting.
