**Final Consideration and Adoption of Mobile Food and Beverage Vendor
Program Bylaws**

The following report has been reviewed and endorsed by the City Manager's Office.

▪ **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

- A. THAT Highways Bylaw Amendment No. 8415, 2025 be finally considered and adopted.
- B. THAT Business License Bylaw Amendment No. 8425, 2025 be finally considered and adopted.

▪ **PURPOSE:**

The purpose of this report is to recommend Council finally considers and adopts Bylaw No. 8415 and Bylaw No. 8425. These bylaw amendments are necessary to implement the Mobile Food and Beverage Vendor Program.

▪ **BACKGROUND:**

At the July 22, 2024 Regular Meeting, Council gave first readings to Bylaw No. 8415 and Bylaw No. 8425, approved the Mobile Food and Beverage Vendor (MFBV) Policy, and authorized the new pilot program.

At the September 15, 2025 Regular Meeting, Council gave second and third readings to Bylaw No. 8415 and Bylaw No. 8425, and approved an updated MFBV Policy. No changes were proposed to the bylaw amendments between first and second/third readings.

▪ **DISCUSSION:**

If Council finally considers and adopts Bylaw No. 8415 and Bylaw No. 8425, the pilot program (set to expire on October 15, 2025) will be replaced with an ongoing, permanent program governed by these bylaw amendments and the MFBV Policy.
