ADOPTION OF MINUTES

1. Minutes of the October 23, 2025 Transportation Advisory Committee Meeting.

TRAFFIC CALMING

2. **Traffic Calming along 53A Street**

Materials

- Memorandum from the General Manager, Engineering dated January 6, 2026 regarding 53A Street.
- PowerPoint presentation titled “Transportation Advisory Committee” (On Table).

With the aid of a PowerPoint presentation, Engineering staff spoke to a request for traffic calming measures on 53A Street near 10 Avenue. Staff advised that a traffic count analysis indicates vehicle speeds are generally within the posted speed limit, aside from a few outliers. The Delta Police Department (DPD) has reported no major collisions in the area. Staff noted that traffic patterns on 53A Street are expected to normalize now that sewer upgrades on 56 Street have been completed, and staff will continue to monitor the area.

3. **Reduce Speed Limit in Imperial Village**

Materials

- Memorandum from the General Manager, Engineering dated January 6, 2026 regarding Imperial Village.
- PowerPoint presentation titled “Transportation Advisory Committee” (On Table).

With the aid of a PowerPoint presentation, Engineering staff spoke to a request to reduce the speed limit in Imperial Village. Staff advised that traffic count analyses were conducted at two locations and indicated that vehicle speeds were generally below the posted speed limit. The Delta Police Department reported no collisions in the area. A staff report will be forthcoming to Council with a recommended strategy for requests to lower posted speed limits on local roads in Delta.

NEW BUSINESS

4. **55B and Ladner Trunk Road Intersections**

- Email from S. Smith dated October 6, 2025 regarding Modifications to the Intersections of 55B and Ladner Trunk Road (On Table).
- Diagram of 55B and Ladner Trunk Road intersection (On Table).

With the aid of a PowerPoint presentation, Engineering staff spoke to a request for a traffic pattern change at the intersection of Ladner Trunk Road and 55B Street. Staff noted that intersection functions as a pedestrian signal and has an offset configuration. Staff will consider upgrades to a full traffic signal as part of a future capital improvement project on Ladner Trunk Road and will provide a response to the writer.

5. **Ladner Trunk Road and 62 Street**

Materials

- PowerPoint presentation titled “Transportation Advisory Committee” (On Table).

With the aid of a PowerPoint presentation, Engineering staff provided background information on a request for traffic calming measures at the intersection of Ladner Trunk Road and 62 Street, following a reported near-miss incident involving a pedestrian. Staff advised that recent upgrades were completed near Holly Park School, including the installation of a raised crosswalk with flashing lights, a message board sign, and upgraded LED lighting.

The Delta Police Department reported no notable collisions in the area over the past five years. Staff will conduct a safety review, and a report to Council will be forthcoming.
